**K-State 8/General Education Requirements for Transfer Students

For example, when a K-State course is tagged for one or two areas, then the "equivalent" course from another institution will be tagged for the same one or two areas. The student's dean's office will determine -- on a case by case basis -- which K-State 8 area(s) can be allocated to a non-equivalent transfer course.
